- UK developments need to be done against an international backdrop and should involve collaborative activities
- opportunity to get a critical mass European initiative underway with UK in one of lead positions
- successful deployment of technology essential in an ever increasingly competitive and risk adverse marketplace
- need for consistent policy to give industry confidence to invest
